Acts 5

I.	The Deception of Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1-11)
	Chapter 4 ends with a great sense of fellowships among the saints:
	- They were of one heart and soul.
	- All their needs were met.
	- The Apostles with great witness reflected the power of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.
	- Great grace was upon them.
	- Persons gave freely of their possessions.
	- The Apostles distributed to every person according to their needs.
	- Barnabas sold his land and gave it to the Apostles or laid it at their feet.

Ananias and Sapphira tried to copy Barnabas' efforts by selling their land. Instead of them giving everything to the Apostles, they held back some of the money for themselves.

Peter confronted Ananias as he brought the offering. Peter asked Ananias why did he lie about his offering? Ananias died on the spot.

Three hours later, Sapphira came looking for her husband. Peter asked, tell me whether you sold the land for this much? And she said, yes.

Peter confronted her and said, how is it that you both have agreed together to tempt the Spirit of the Lord?

The consequence that came upon Ananias was the same consequence that came upon Sapphira.

Why such harsh consequences?

The lie was agreed upon by both parties. They plotted or planned to hold back some of the money.

Peter made it plain that they could have retained the entire amount for themselves, but they chose to deceive the Apostles.

The consequences were designed to bring fear among the church. Fear here means reverence or respect and not to be afraid. The work of the Holy Spirit is to be our Comforter. Evoking fear or intimidation would be counter-productive for the Holy Spirit.
